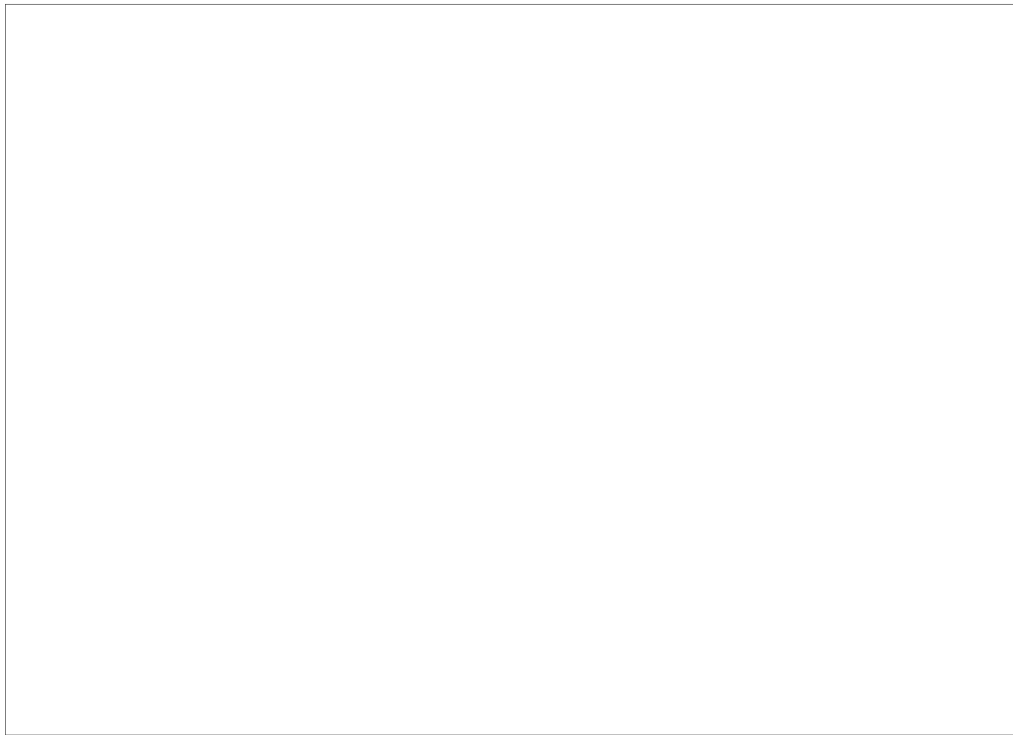

- On 3 February 1951, fourteen artillery pieces were still parked in the billeting area of the Luftnachrichten Kaserne, Bernau (N 53/Z 96). Trucks _____

_____ were parked near the guns. One JS tank left the installation through the gate on Wandlitzerchaussee and was later seen engaged in driving practice at the drill field.

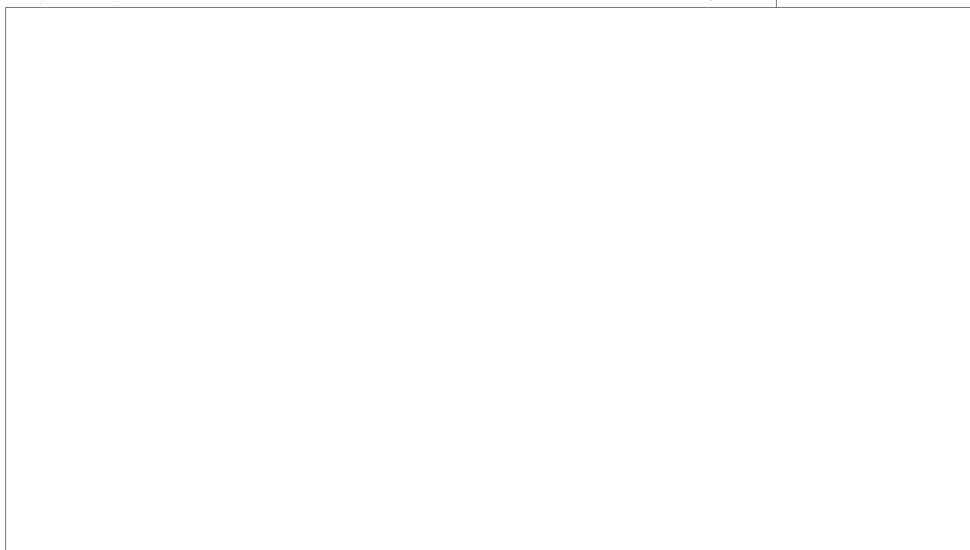

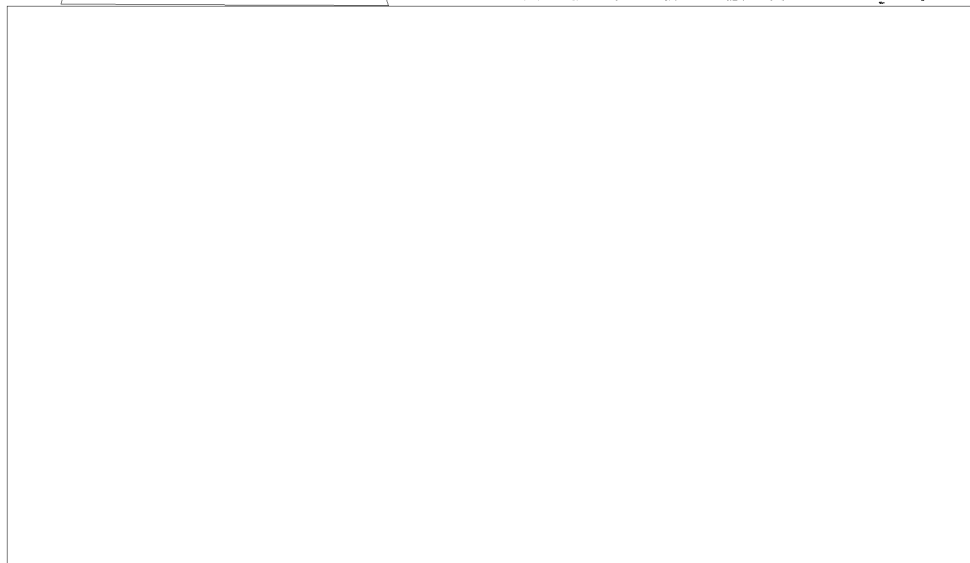

Tank trucks [redacted]

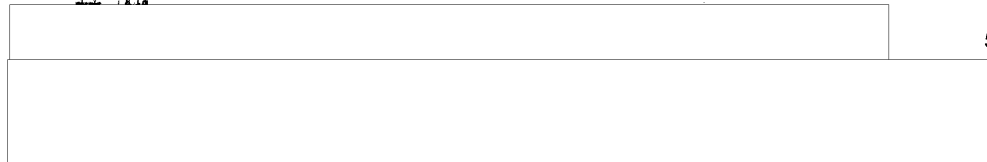
[redacted] were observed in the traffic to the depot.

8. About 45 trucks, [redacted] were seen at the new wooden shed at the Brieftaubenstation (pigeon station) on 20 February. Four partially covered 37-mm guns were emplaced in the billeting area, while another three 37-mm AA guns were used for gun drill, each gun being manned by 11 EM.
