- 5. [redacted] 500 officers and men of the Liang Kuang Column, [redacted] all natives of Hainan, left Chuchiang (珠江) Village, east of P'anyu (113-26, 23-01), by motor junk for Yulin (109-34, 18-13) where they were to receive marine training. [redacted] 50X1-HUM
- 6. [redacted] approximately 500 Chinese Communist Marines, trained on Hainan, left Yulin for Canton in two landing craft. [redacted] 50X1-HUM
- 7. [redacted] a Soviet ship of approximately 3,000 tons arrived at Yulin Harbor with 100 former Japanese Navy personnel and 50 boxes of marine mines aboard. As of 9 April the Japanese and mines were still on board and the ship was south of Hungsha (紅沙) in the Yulin area. [redacted] 50X1-HUM
- 8. [redacted] three large new-type Soviet-made submarines [redacted] arrived at Yulin. [redacted] 50X1-HUM
- 9. [redacted] all Chinese Communist warships at Yulin were equipped with four rocket launchers each.

10. [] the K'UAIHUA (快華), K'AIMING (開明), and another ship, all under the Kwangtung River Defense Command, arrived at Nanshanweitao (南山衛島) from Whampoa with 17 Chinese Communist and Soviet technicians and 100 floating mines aboard.
11. [] these ships began laying mines in the area from Nanshanweitao to Tawanshan (113-44, 21-56). All fishermen in this area were warned to stay clear of the mined areas. 50X1-HUM
12. [] Chinese Communist vessels along the south Fukien coast were as follows: 50X1-HUM
- a. P'ingt'an (119-47, 25-30) area: 38 motor junks and 45 junks.
 - b. Changp'7 (117-35, 24-06) coastal area: 2 tugs, 4 motor junks, and 20 junks.
 - c. Tungshan (117-31, 23-45)-Chaoan (117-12, 23-44) coastal area: 2 tugs, 8 motor junks, and approximately 30 wooden junks.
13. [] Chinese Communist gunboats from Whampoa to the mouth of the Pearl River were as follows: 50X1-HUM
- a. The CH'ENGHAI (澄海), TAT'UNG (大同), TACHIN (大進), P'INGTUNG (平等), HUNGHSING (紅星), LUHSIN (魯迅), PENG'PAI (澎湃), CH'IUPAI (秋白), NIEHERH (聶耳), T'AOPEH (鰲鰲), and CHIEHFANG (衛教) Numbers 2, 5 and 7, all under the Kwangtung River Defense Command.
 - b. Four small gunboats of the Canton Water Public Security Bureau.
 - c. Eight small gunboats of the Kwangtung Military District Command.
 - d. Ten small gunboats of Chinese Communist troops in the Wanshan Islands.
14. [] Chinese Communist gunboats from Whampoa to the Hsichiang (112-23-) area (sic) were as follows: 50X1-HUM
- a. The HSIENFENG (先鋒), FENTOU (奮鬥), KUOKAN (果敢), JUNMIN (人民) Numbers 1-14, and CHIEHFANG Numbers 1, 3, 4 and 6, all under the Kwangtung River Defense Command.
 - b. Thirty-four tugs of the Kwangtung Public Security Bureau. 50X1-HUM
15. [] 40 wooden vessels, part of an order for 200 such vessels by the Kwangtung River Defense Headquarters, from the Ho Tso Dockyard, Yangchiang (111-53, 21-52), were towed to the Whampoa area for the fitting of engines and steel plates. 50X1-HUM
16. [] the Kwangtung River Defense Command gunboats CH'IENCHIN (前進) and CHIEHFANG left Canton for Chiangmen (113-06, 22-34) with approximately 1,000 trained militia as reinforcements for local troops under the Kwangtung Military District Command. 50X1-HUM
17. [] the gunboat CHI HFANG left Chiangmen for Canton with approximately 100 drums of gasoline and 200 sets of truck tires aboard. This cargo had arrived in Chiangmen from Macao. 50X1-HUM
18. [] the Kwangtung Military District Command sent 22 boxes of marine mines, two mines in each box, to the Kwangtung River Defense Headquarters "Mine Laying Squad" in the Huiyang (114-26, 23-05) area. These mines are to be laid along the coast in the Huiyang area. 50X1-HUM

- 19. [Redacted] approximately 20 small non-seagoing steam craft of various size had been completed at the Whampoa shipyard. The capacity of these craft ranges from 4 to 11 persons, and each is equipped with one or two machine guns. [Redacted]
- 20. [Redacted] two Chinese Communist warships, each approximately 1,000 tons, arrived in the Hsiangshan (121-51, 29-29) Harbor area. They are to be used for the transporting of food and military supplies to Tanghai (122-06, 30-03) from this area.
- 21. [Redacted] four large Soviet cargo ships were anchored in the Paiot'an (白鵝潭) area, Canton.
- 22. [Redacted] the Kwangtung authorities were building a naval supply base on Weichou Island (109- , 21-). [Redacted] the Chinese Communist Army 6 Engineer Regiment was transferred to Weichou Island from Hainan. [Redacted] 26 freight cars of building materials arrived at Canton via the Canton-Hankow Railroad and were stored in the Hsits'un (西村) and Shaho (沙河) areas, Canton, where they would await shipment to Weichou on the Soviet ship Hsien-te-ko-fu (先得哥夫) (? Sentikov), which was to arrive at Canton [Redacted]
