- Three MIG-15s made individual practice flights at the Brandenburg-Briest (N 53/Z 13) airfield on 12 March 1951 between 2 and 7 p.m. The longest flying time observed was 28 minutes. Twelve additional jet fighters of the same type were seen on the eastern edge of the field. \* flying continued after dusk until 9 p.m.; the runway was illuminated. 50X1-HUM
  - The radio installation with four masts, located about 400 meters south-southwest of Briest, was completed. \*\* Trucks were seen entering and leaving the airfield. 50X1-HUM
- \* Comment. the airfield is occupied by one fighter regiment which belongs to the fighter division stationed in Gerbst. The total number of MIG-15s stationed in Briest is not known but estimated at about 30. Twenty-one A/C were counted there. 50X1-HUM
- \*\* Comment. the radio installation is an Adcock DF. 50X1-HUM
