1. Three single-engine biplanes and about 96 Pe-2s, of which 84 were counted, were parked at the Strasshof (P 49/S 50) airfield on 19 February 1951. Two or three Pe-2s made continual local flights between 8 a.m. and 12:30 p.m.
  2. Twenty-one officers, ranking up to captain, and 90 EM wearing black-bordered blue epaulets were seen near the various quarters in Strasshof. Jeep [redacted] ambulance [redacted] and trucks [redacted] were seen in front of the quarters and offices. 50X1-HUM
  3. One Pe-2 plane was under repair in the aircraft repair shop in Deutsch-Wagram (P 49/S 50). Within ninety minutes one senior lieutenant, three captains and three majors were seen in the main quarters' area. The majors left the quarters in a passenger car [redacted] 50X1-HUM
  4. Motor vehicles parked in front of the quarters and offices in Deutsch-Wagram included: Trucks [redacted] oil tank trucks [redacted] tank trucks [redacted] and passenger car [redacted] 50X1-HUM
