1. On 22 February 1951, four Pe-2s, five twin-engine transports, including one with silvery paint, and about 60 fighters with in-line engines were seen at the Wiener Neustadt (O 40/A 35) airfield. Forty-six fighters were counted and the remainder estimated. There was no activity at the field.
 2. A Pe-2 was under repair in the Theresienfeld repair shop. [redacted] 50X1-HUM
 3. Seventy soldiers wearing black-bordered blue epaulets were drilling in the yard of the former Nachrichten Kaserne. Trucks [redacted] and [redacted] and ambulance [redacted] were seen there. * 50X1-HUM

- [redacted] Mainly fighters and some transports are stationed there. [redacted]
- [redacted] One fighter regiment is still believed to be stationed in Wiener-Neustadt.
