the sapplied the following information on military units and unstallations in the vicinity of Kulbyshev (53-12%, 50-09%) as of December 1983;

a. The Kurbyshev Vovenkomat (lilitary Draft Board) was located on Ovrag

lodyclahebikov Street.

b. The 162nd Artillery Regiment, located in Syzran (57-06N, 57-47E), belonged to an unidentified infantry division whose headquarters was in Kulbyshev. The division headquarters was located in the former barracks of the 7th Communications Regiment on Casiconikov Prospekt, at the end of streetcar lines numbers 2 and 7. The commander of the division was Taj. Gen. (fmu) Chernukha.

c. The 5th Stalinski Howitzer Patialion (Divizion), located in Fyzran, belonged to the 162nd Artillery depiment. It was equipped with 122 mm nowitzers. The commander of the Battalion was Capt. (fnu) Yeroyemin. The Battalion was actually of commany strength, since it had only three officers and 120 endisted men. The other two officers were Lt. (fnu) Zetsevich of Yagoslav nationality, and an unidentified political officer (zampolit).

d. The 6th Cattalien was also located in Syzran and also belowed to the 162nd Artillery Regiment. The 6th was equipped with 100 mm guns.


e. Lt. Col. (Ina) Novemochkin commanded both the 5th Howitzer Sattalion and the 5th Habitalion, but his exact title and status are uncertain.

f. The military unit number (viskovaya chast) of the 5th Powitzer Battalion was 22267.

g. In addition to the 5th and 6th Battalions, the 162nd Artillery Megiment also and an acti-aircraft artillery battalion.

h. There was an infaminy officer's training school located in the same garrison (voyenny corodok) in Sysran.

There was an independent training battalion in Kuibyshov which had about 120 enlinted men. The voiskovava chast was 75631. The commander of the battalion was Taj. (fmu) Bolgeshko or Dovzhesko, and the political officer was Lt. Coll. (fmu) Strelkov. The 2nd Company consisted of recruits who were slated for clerical jobs, and was commanded by Maj. (fmu) Moiseyenko. There were four platence in the 2nd Company, of which the 2nd Platen was commanded by Lt. (ladimir (pnu) Bragimov, and the 3rd Plateon by Sgt. (fmu, Zomulo.
