1. In February 1951 part of the Chinese Communist Naval Academy moved from Port Arthur to Tungchen (東鎮), in the suburbs of Tsingtao. The head of this academy is Soviet admiral Gurienchikov, the deputy head is T'AO Tien (陶田), and the commissar is LIN Ch'i-ho (林啟和). In early June there were 2,800 trainees at this school, 600 from Port Arthur and the remainder from North China. The academy places emphasis on the training of submarine personnel.
2. In February 1951 an amphibious training center moved from Port Arthur to the Tsingtao area. The training period at this center is eight months. In early June there were 4,000 trainees at the center, most of whom were selected from regular Chinese Communist Army units.
3. In early June there were approximately 500 Soviet marines and a detachment of Soviet naval police at Tsingtao.
4. In early June Soviet naval captain Wayekulev was deputy commander of the Port Arthur-Dairen Military District and commander of the Tsingtao detachment of that district. Wayekulev is virtually in control not only of Chinese Communist naval and military affairs in Tsingtao but also of the civil administration of that city. His office is at Number 57 T'ai-p'ing (太平) Road, Tsingtao.
5. In early June Soviet naval commander Somichev was deputy head of the Chinese Communist Tsingtao Harbor Office, which is under Chinese Communist Navy Headquarters, Peiping.
6. In early June YANG Kuo-ch'ing (楊國清), a representative of the Tsingtao Naval Academy, conferred with HUA Kang (華岡), the president of Shantung University, Tsingtao, regarding the recruiting of members of the June graduating class who majored in electrical, mechanical, or chemical engineering. As a result of this conference it was decided that all these graduates should be

compelled to enter the Tsingtao Naval Academy provided they passed the academy's physical and other entrance examinations and provided the Northeast Heavy Industries Department did not desire to recruit them for work in Manchuria. If the services of any of these graduates was requested by this department, then their disposition was to be decided by the Shantung University Administrative Council.

7. In mid-June 87 students of Shantung University passed a physical examination given by a Tsingtao Naval Academy doctor at the university and were notified by the academy authorities to report to the academy for registration on 15 July.
8. In mid-June the Tsingtao Naval Academy was training naval personnel for surface craft as well as for submarines. There were very few submarine trainees because of the high physical requirements.
