1.	Prior to May 1951, the Flak Kaserne on Luebsche Strasse, Wismar (M 5h/T 49), which is difficult to observe, was occupied by only about 900 infantry troops and 400 to 500 artillery troops. On 26 April, a convoy of 1 personnel carrier and 20 trucks, occupied by 300 to 350 infantrymen and towing 4 artillery pieces of about 70-mm, entered the installation, having common the direction of Schwerin. Seventeen of the trucks were numbered:

	Officers seen walking between the installation and the officers billets opposite the installation on 9 May included: 1 artillery colonel, 2 artillery lieutenant colonels, 6 artillery majors, 2 infantry majors and numerous company—grade officers. Five platoons of about 30 infantrymen each were seen returning to the installation from the training area, and about 200 infantrymen and 80 artillerymen were drilling in the billeting area. A radar set with ears, connected by a cable to a truck, was seen in the southeastern corner of the billeting area. Vehicles observed in barracks traffic were numbered:  25X1C
2.	About 100 meters southwest of the Flak Kaserne there was a DT station with 25X1C four wooden sheds, three of which housed Adcock DTs. Because observed soldiers walking between the DT station and the barracks installation, he concluded that the DT station was occupied continually.
