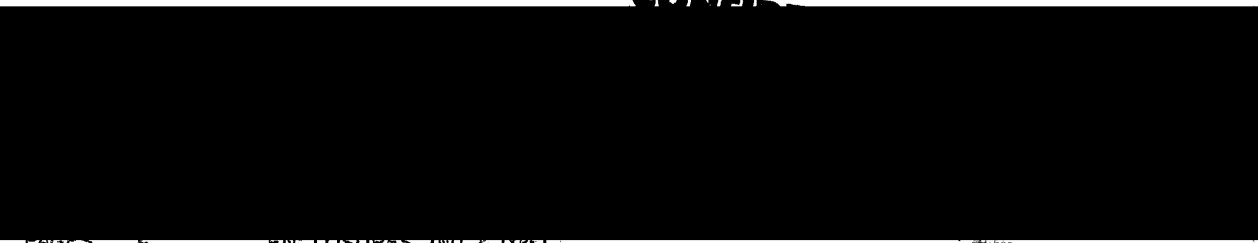

1. Prior to 27 March 1951, the Volkspolizei school in Erfurt-Petersberg had the designation VPD II, Erfurt. It numbered about 1,200 police from the entire Soviet Zone of Germany, with 800 of them belonging to the school cadre. The trainees were police who had been selected to be officers.
2. The school was organized into 8 companies of 100 police each, with 4 Zuge to a company. The 8th Company consisted of newly recruited FDJ functionaries who, although they were officer candidates, were scheduled to go through a longer instruction course than the others.

4. The school trained prospective VP officers to fill positions up to company commanders (Kommissar) in nine-month courses. These courses consisted of 3 months of individual training, 3 months of group training and 3 months of platoon training. The training included two hours a week of political indoctrination and three hours a week of political information; 20 hours a month of tactical indoctrination; training with Zekolov heavy machine guns and Degtyarev light machine guns, theoretical training with T-34 and JS tanks, and training with field guns, mortars, parachute guns and mountain guns; theoretical and practical engineer training, including the construction and removal of obstacles, bridge construction, river crossing by boats, demolition of bunkers, laying and clearing of mines, demolition work and voluntary group instruction on aircraft.
5. Off-duty hours during which the police were granted town leave were from 5 to 12 p.m. on Wednesdays, from 4 p.m. on Saturdays to 2 a.m. on Sundays and from 2 to 12 p.m. on Sundays. *
