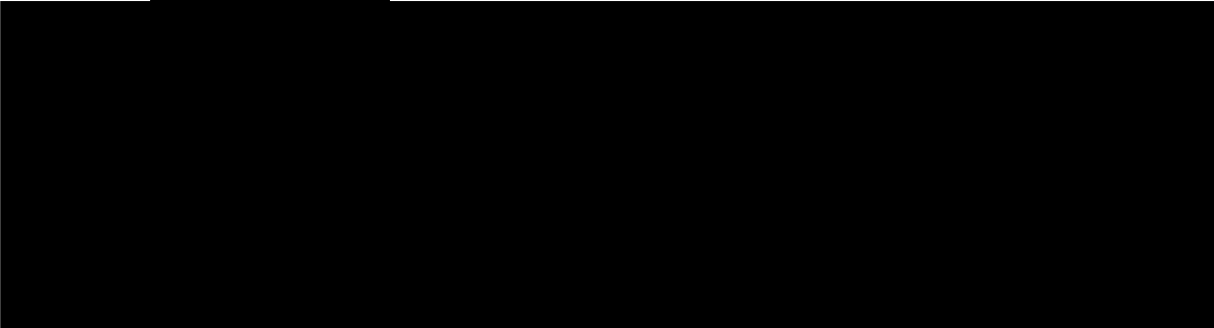

SUPPLEMENT TO REPORT NO. 25X1X



1. On 19 April 1951, Chinese residents of Pusan organized a committee for a "Chinese in Korea Anti-Communist Movement," with the approval of the Chinese Nationalist embassy. They established headquarters at 589 Choryang-dong, Pusan, announced that their membership included all Chinese living in Korea, and stated their objectives as follows: "Communist China, prompted by imperialist Soviet Russia, has invaded Korea, a country friendly to us, by means of arms. Under these circumstances, Chinese living in Korea have decided to organize a committee for this movement, to guide all Chinese to resist Communism within the Chinese community and to fight against international Communism by keeping close contact with Korean organizations. This will aid the forces of the Republic of Korea and the United Nations which are now heroically fighting for righteousness, and we Chinese will be part of Nationalist China's vow to restore the continent against Communists and the USSR."

3. The regulations adopted by the committee are as follows:

1. This committee is called the Chinese in Korea Anti-Communist Movement Committee.
2. This committee proposes to perform the duty of resistance against Communism and the USSR, as the leader of Chinese nationals in Korea.
3. This committee is located at the same place as the Republic of Korea government and is included in the federation of organizations of Chinese in Korea.
4. This committee is under the federation of organizations of Chinese in Korea and is under the guidance and supervision of the Nationalist embassy.
5. The committee includes a chairman, a vice-chairman, and 15 to 21 members.
6. The committee has a chief executive and a number of executive members, to be determined by administrative needs. If possible, committee members should serve as members of the executive, or members of the office of the federation of Chinese organizations.
7. When circumstances require, a branch committee can be set up wherever a group of Chinese live; the organization of branch committees will be described separately.
8. The chief aims of this committee are:
  - a. To issue propaganda against Communism and the USSR among Chinese in Korea.
  - b. To resist the aggression of international Communists in collaboration and cooperation with Republic of Korea organizations.
  - c. To lead the Chinese in Korea to cooperate with the ROK and UN forces directly or indirectly in the war against Communism.
  - d. To aid and cooperate in the restoration of the continent through resistance to the Communists and the USSR.
9. Funds for this committee will be contributed when necessary through the federation of Chinese organizations by Chinese in Korea.
10. This committee will be legal from the date of its registration with the Chinese embassy in Korea and will be reported to appropriate Korean authorities for further registration.

11. The regulations stated herein are to be in effect from the date of approval by the embassy. They are effected through the decision of the committee and later amendments are to become effective through the same procedure.

12. The committee made a public proclamation of its anti-Communist aims in late April.\*
