	Prior to November 1950, the old barracks installation west of Wolnosci (Liberty) Square, Bielsko Biala (Q 50/X 88), quartered several company-size units of female SP (Labor Service) personnel who were 17 or 18 years old. They normally served for two menths, but could volunteer for a longer period. The SP women, who gave the impression of being well disciplined, were primarily assigned to work in the weaving mills and tailor shops which manufactured military articles, such as tentcloth, field bags, rucksacks, etc. They were given no training in the use of firearms. They were quartered in an installation consisting of four barracks buildings, a warehouse, and several stables. *	
2.	The Artillery Barracks on the eastern bank of the Biala River quartered soldiers who were Polish Army uniforms and service caps with a red band. According to local residents, the troops were artillerymen. **	!
