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25X1X 25X1X 25X1X	There was an ammunition depot of about 50 acres in the woods about 50 meters southwest of the barracks installation, on the south ide of the Mi. Galkow Justynow (Q 52/P 03) road. The depot was established before World Wir I and was also used as an ammunition depot in World War II; one parts who blown up by Polish partisans in 1944. The depot was equipped with a raile of spur, which led to the Galkow railroad station past the north west corner of the barracks installation, and served outgoing ammunition signents made by the Soviets in 1945 and 1946. According to Polish civilians, the depot was cerated exclusively by troops who were billeted in the barracks installation in Galkow. As they traveled from Galkow to Lodz by train in 1946 and 1949, I frequently observed loaded freight trains entering the ammunition depot. They saw no motor vehicles at the installation.					
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- 4. No barracks or other Polish Army installations were located in Brzeziny prior to April 1950. The MO district headquarters, staffed with 20 to 25 men and subordinate to a section of the MO general headquarters on ul. Jaracza in Lodz, was on the south side of the main street running in the direction of Rawa Mazowiecka (2 52/P 43).
- 5. The UB (Security Police) district office, staffed with about 40 men, was in a building on the west side of al. Calkowska, opposite the town hall. The office had motor vehicles at its disposal. According to Poles, the years served in the UB counted as active military duty. The staff of the office included an officer the were a visor-type service cap with a dark-blue velvet band and a silver cord.
