1. In the morning of 22 May 1951, a train of 11 converted boxcars, whose locomotive was under steam and headed toward Beelitz, was at the loading ramp of Cottbus (N 52/A 57) railroad station. Soldiers wearing red-bordered black epaulets with tank insignia were standing beside the boxcars. *
2. Except for soldiers with red-bordered black epaulets on guard duty and construction work on one of the barracks buildings, no activity was observed at the Alvensleben Kaserne in Cottbus.
- C 3. The bulk of the troops from the Dischenchen Kaserne were at Reisswasser. On 14 June, about 25 men wearing red-bordered black epaulets were seen in the barracks installation while about 200 men, apparently recruits, practiced rifle and machine gun firing and drilled with two 45-mm AT guns at the drill field east of the road from Dischenchen to the Herzdorf railroad station. [REDACTED] entered the installation.
4. A craftsman employed at the Funker Kaserne said that the rear detail there had a strength of 35 men. No vehicular traffic or radio communication activities were noticed there. **
