1. On 9 June 1951, only two AA guns were emplaced on the southwestern edge of Schoenwalde (N 53 1/2 66) airfield. Troops wearing red-bordered black epaulets were billeted in three two-story buildings about 40 meters long which were located at the end of the asphalt road that runs into the woods about 500 meters south of the road to Hennigsdorf. Twenty trucks, each carrying about 25 soldiers who wore red-bordered black epaulets and were armed with carbines or submachine guns, were seen leaving these troops quarters. Ten of the trucks

2. Two semi-underground sheds on the west side of the Boetzow-Schoenwalde road contained ammunition. The sheds were guarded by sentries who wore red-bordered black epaulets.

3. The Soviet units which turned in washing at the laundry in Falkensee included Arty Units [REDACTED] from Schoenwalde airfield. On 25 May, Unit [REDACTED] turned in 130 shirts on [REDACTED], 400 shirts on a truck [REDACTED]. The [REDACTED] previously known from [REDACTED] 25X1C

\* Comment. According to the [REDACTED] components of the 31st AAA Div are still believed to be stationed at Schoenwalde airfield. [REDACTED] possibly assigned to the Hq 31st AAA Div at Schoenwalde. This assumption is strengthened by the low number of shirts turned in. [REDACTED] unidentified unit of the 31st AAA Div in Boetzow.
