Bruck on the Leitha River.

1. On 1 June 1951, traffic of military personnel and vehicles to the troop camp in the wooded area southeast of Bruck (P 49/X 77) was observed from the old war memorial just south of the bridge across the Leitha River in Bruck. Officers seen going from town to the camp during one hour included 14 lieutenants wearing red-bordered black epaulets with tank insignia, 2 senior lieutenants and 1 junior lieutenant wearing red-bordered black epaulets with the crose-gun-barrel insignia, 8 senior lieutenants wearing red-bordered black epaulets, including one with tank insignia, 4 captains wearing red-bordered black epaulets, including three with tank insignia, 2 majors wearing red-bordered black epaulets with tank insignia and 1 senior lieutenant with red service color and a red cap band. Only a few NCOs and EM were seen. They wore red-bordered black epaulets, including some with tank insignia. No armored vehicles or tracks of such vehicles were noticed. The following motor vehicles were identified:

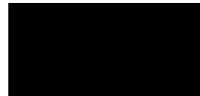

Open Kapitann occupied by 2 officers besides the driver, sedan going toward the camp.

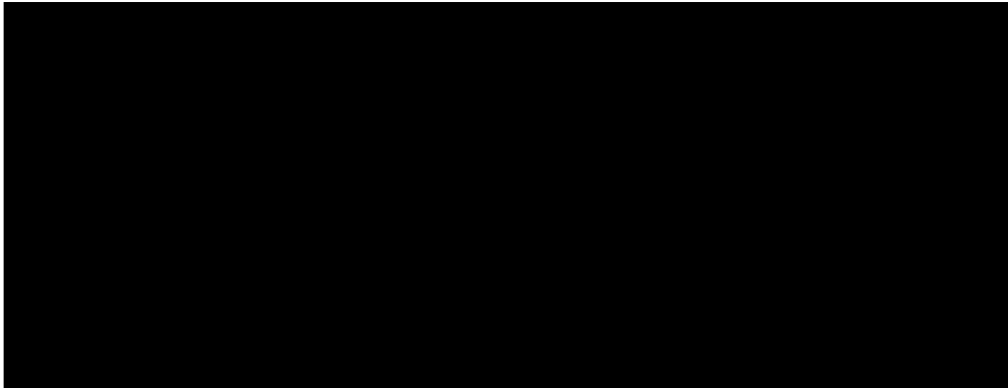

3. On 26 May, 26 apparently new trucks were parked in the yard of the Artillerie Kaserne in Wiener Neustadt (O 48/X 34). Three of the trucks had canvas-covered weapons, probably AA machine guns. Gate guards wore red-bordered black epaulets. Four lieutenants with crossed-gun-barrel insignia left the installation. No weapons were seen in the portion of the barracks yard which was open to view.

Source confirms motor vehicle numbers periodically reported by other sources from Bruck on the Leitha River. Source confirms the 25X1B 15th Tank Regt of the 13th Gds Mecz Div in Bruck until 23 May 1951.
