The legal department of the Bank of China demanded a retraction of this report by the Chung Shing Jit Pao which published the information on 19 July 1.51. TAN Kok Chor, managing director of the paper and Singapore Kuomintang (KMT) leader, gave orders to disregard the notice. The Chung Shing Jit Par is no longer indebted to the Bank of China, although it still owes money to the Kwangtung Provincial Bank, the manager of which is friendly to the pro-KMT publication.

reported that the Singapore branch of the Bank of China is losing money at the rate of (Straits) \$20,000 a month, and is paying the crew of the SS HAI HSUAN a total of \$2,000 monthly.

The SS HAI HSUAN, which has been anchored in Singapore for the past 19 months, is believed to be a Chinese Communist communication center. The vessel was recently surveyed for seaworthiness and was declared in good condition although there was thick marine growth under the hull. At this time the hip's radio was reported to be in continual use. British authorities indicated during May 1950 that it is doubtful if Singapore emergency regulations are broad enough to permit seizure of the ship; however recent reports suggest that passage of legislation permitting the Singapore Government to seal the transmitters of ships at anchor in Singapore harbor might be aimed at the HAI HSUAN.
