- On 11 May LIU Shao-ch'i, in the capacity as chairman of the Indochina People's Liberation Committee, instructed that 500 graduates of the National Defense Youth Army Cadre Training School (國防青年軍幹部學校) at Hankow be sent to Indochina to work with Ho Chi Minh forces on military and political matters. At the request of HO, LIU has instructed authorities in Kwangtung and Kwangsi to send 100 capable agents each to help HO Chi-Minh in conducting secret service activities. The agents will reach Indochina in late May.
- The Sino-Indochinese Joint Operational Staff Department has changed its name to the Sino-Indochinese Joint Operational Committee (中越聯合作戰參謀委員會). Personnel of the new committee are as follows:

On 10 June a Ho Chi Minh delegation of three persons, consisting of SAO Ch'eng-chung (高成忠), CH'EN Chin-chung (陳進忠), and YUAN Shou-chih (阮守志) accompanied by LEE Ch'uan-feng (林泉風), assistant director of the Hanning Branch of the Indochinese People's Liberation Committee, and Ya-erh-lu (葉爾魯), a Soviet advisor, arrived in Canton. On 11 June they called on FANG Fang and HUANG I-p'ing (黃一平). They have rented the premises of 52 Fuhsing (復興) Road, Shameen, Canton, for the site of the liaison mission in Kwangtung, [REDACTED] responsible for the transport of military supplies to Vietnam.

## ILLEGIB

As the result of a directive issued by the Kwangtung Military District Command on 10 May, the Kwangtung Labor Federation has successfully concluded a drive for 300 drivers in the formation of the "Anti-France Support Indo-China Motor Car Volunteer Transportation Corps." On 27 June the Transportation Corps under YU K'o-chang (吳克章) and two deputies, TS'ING To-sheng (曾錚) and SUNG Chi-k'ai (宋繼凱), boarded the transport YU KUC (德國) of the Central and South China Naval Command at Whampoa. The party was sent off by CHU Kuang; LIANG Kwang; LIAO Ssu-kuang (廖似光), Secretary of the Kwangtung Labor Federation; SUNG Lei-ching (宋繼菁), deputy chief of the Provincial Labor Bureau; LEE Chiang-yun (林鋸雲), chief of the Provincial Labor Bureau; and 1,200 representatives of the various labor unions.
