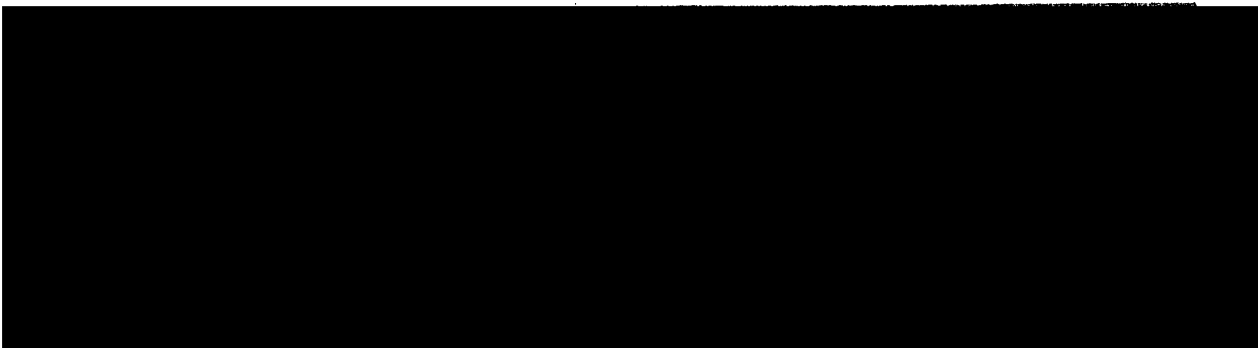

The production of the Elbe Plant # in Rosslau (M 52/E 17) in February 1951 included seventy-four 40 KVA steam engines, thirty-two 35-HP Diesel engines, eighteen 100-HP Diesel engines and seven 200-HP Diesel engines. Winches for fishing nets were also manufactured, but production figures are not known. The plant is reported now to specialize only in the production of steam engines and Diesel engines.
2. The April 1951 production comprised sixty-one 40-KVA steam engines for a railroad car plant in Weimar (M 51/J 57), twenty-nine 35-HP Diesel engines, fourteen 100-HP Diesel engines, and eleven 200-HP Diesel engines. Net winches were not produced in April 1951.

Comment. Until 1945 the plant was owned by the Gebr. Sachsenberg Corporation. It is now an enterprise of the VVB (Z) BEM. Until the end of 1950 the plant produced mobile electric generators which were mounted on two wheels and were equipped with a coupling device enabling them to be used as trailers. These mobile units consisted of a 65-HP high-pressure steam engine operating a 40-KW generator. Freshly cut wood, containing as much as 30 percent water, could be used to fire the steam boiler.
