Rule 5

Efforts to be made to achieve aims and objects:

In conformity with Rule 4 of this Program, Jajasan Pembela will publish:

- a. Magazines
- b. Books, pamphlets, etc.
- c. Other reading material

In addition, it will also make other legal efforts.

Rule 6

Capital:

The Institute has an initial capital of R. 100,00 (one hundred ruplahs only) which it received from contributions.

Rule 7

Finance:

The Institute obtains its finances from:

- a. Unconditional contributions and people who sympathize with this Institute
- b. Subscriptions from some donors
- e. Other legal efforts.

Rule 8

Government:

- a. The Governing Council of this Institute consists of a President, two Vice-Presidents, two Secretaries, two Treasurers and four assistants.
- b. The Governing Council is responsible for the activities of the Institute internally as well as externally.
- c. For the first time, the Institute has elected the following persons to sit in the Governing Council for a period of 1 (one) year, namely:

Rule 9

Board of Control:

The Institute is supervised by a Board of Control which consists of three members holding office for one year. The following persons have been elected to the chairs of the Board, namely:

Rule 10

Meetings:

a. A meeting of the Governing Council is held at least once in every quarter of the year or at times considered necessary by the President or his Deputies together with the consent of at least 3 (three) other members of the Governing Council.

b. The meetings of the Governing Council are only legal if they are attended by at least two-thirds of its entire membership.

 The Board of Control holds a meeting at least once in every six months.

Rule 11

Resolutions:

Resolutions adopted in meetings are legal only if more than half of the members present vote for them.

Rule 12

Division of Income:

The income derived from the efforts mentioned in Rule 5 of this Program will be divided as follows:

50 percent for the further intensification of the efforts to achieve the airs and objects of the Institute

25 percent for the support of the various social bodies; these actions have already been approved by the Governing Council.
25 percent for the support of all Institute personnel.

Rule 13

Dissolution:

a. The Institute can be dissolved only by a meeting specially held for the purpose

b. Such a meeting should be attended by every member of the Governing Council, the Board of Control and heads of the various departments, and is held in the presence of a public notary

c. Every member present has the right to give one rote only and any resolution adopted is legal only if two-thirds of the total members present vote for it and if the meeting is attended by at least two-thirds of the members who have the right to attend the meeting.

d. The remaining properties of the Institute are donated to social bodies which are named by this meeting.

Rule 14

Additional Rule:

Matters which have not yet been decided in this Program shall be arranged later by the Governing Council. They shall be grouped into particular rules which are not contrary to the Program.

Rule 15

This Fundamental Rules (Statutes) comes into force a day after its legalization by a Notar:
