The announcement gives a short history of Bo NYJTT 'AVIG and his activities as a leader of the Engage District FUOs and refers to his remaining with the PDF in comosition to the decision of the All Burms PVO Conference held on 12 November 1949 that they should right against the Burms Communist Party (BCP). Bo FYNTT MAING, it is stated, had been successful in rallying the PVOs in Panthawaddy, Pegu, and Theton Districts, who had formerly comperated with the Government, into the fold of the Lower Burma Peoples

Comment. After the open split between the White Pand PVOs and the BCP-led PDF in Merch 1950, there were several reports of the activities of Bo NYUFT MAUNG in Lower Burns which suggested that he was primarily concerned with preventing the PVOs in that area from surrendering to the Covernment. It was suggested at that time that although not openly supporting the PDF he was in fact secretly in league with them and working to prevent any further PVO defection. This is now confirmed by the article referred to above. The publication of Bo NYUNT MAUNG's appointment represents an advance in the BCP's relations with the PVOs but there are still other groups of "YOS with whom no satisfactory agreement has been reached.
