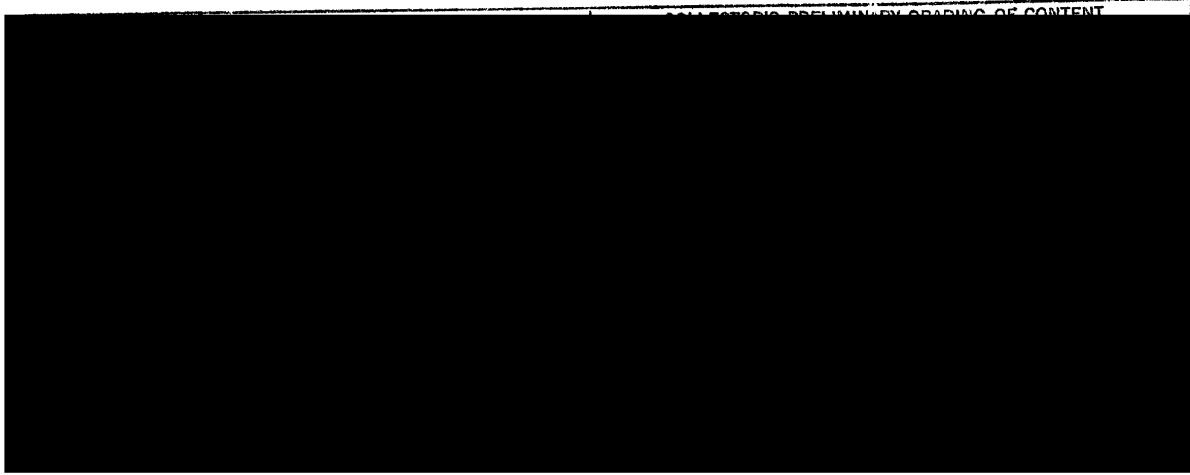

1. Basic Chinese Communist policy envisages an emphasis on southward aggression, leaving matters concerning Northeast Asia largely to the Soviets. The Soviets forced the Chinese to aid the North Koreans; the Chinese regard the fighting there as a sideshow. Hence, the Chinese are very sincere in desiring a cease fire in North Korea.
2. On 27 August the Soviets warned the Chinese Communists that air and naval aid would be forthcoming only at the conclusion of the Korean war. The Soviets have urged the North Koreans to insist on a continuation of the Korean struggle.
3. The Chinese would prefer to strike for significant bases and natural resources in Southeast Asia. They are especially fearful of any important United States aid to Thailand.
