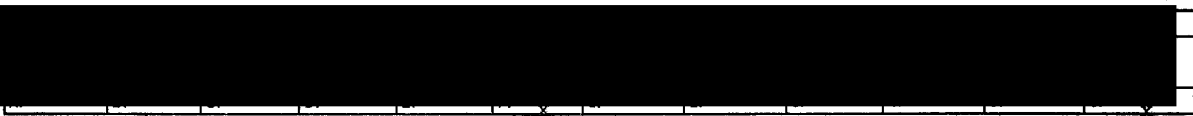

1. Between Kolomea (48-30 N, 25-03 E) and Sniatyn (48-27 N, 25-34 E) three airfields are located.
 - a. Three kilometers from Kolomea there is an old airfield which was built by the Poles.
 - b. Between the villages of Chilibyczyn and Borschtschiw a large new airfield is under construction. This field has nine large taxiways (Rollbahnen) of six kilometers and 12 taxiways of three kilometers, and has a large number of jet planes and heavy bombers.
 - c. In 1951 the Soviets began the construction of a new airfield near the village of Sibraniwka, at which location there is also heavy military activity.
2. In the village of Tulukiw, near the kolkhoz, the Soviets have built a barracks, as well as a headquarters for application (sic; recruitment?).
3. There is a large flying school located in Borschtschiw.
4. Between the villages of Rudnyky and Nynczi are located both light and heavy artillery.
