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1. In July 1951 the following firms in Macao were engaged in underground work for the Chinese Communists:

2. In July 1951 LIU T'ieh-fu⁵ was in close touch with Percy Ch'EN⁷, and the latter's office was serving as an underground center for the Chinese Communists, with CH'LI Chu (陳鉅), an army officer, in charge of liaison duties. LIU's assistant, HAO Chieh-shin⁸, had established an underground headquarters in the Nan Kuo Hotel, Nathan Road, Howson.

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3. In July 1951 MO Ying-k'uei⁵ was frequenting the Huiyang Y.M.C.A., 602 Nathan Road, Kowloon, for the purpose of recruiting young men from the Huiyang (114-26, 23-05) District for Communist work. He was also urging TSI'AO Hsueh-yu (曹学愚), secretary general of the Hong Kong Chinese Chamber of Commerce, to accelerate his efforts to collect information on anti-Communist and anti-Soviet activities in Hong Kong.
4. LI Ting-wu (李庭沃), second in charge of the Hsin Hua Trading Company, an agency of the South China Sub-Bureau (SCSB) in Hong Kong, was formerly a member of the Kuomintang (KMT) but defected to the Communists. In July he was helping WU Chih-min (吴智民) organize the infiltration of Communist agents into the United States, recruit for Communist work (Chinese returning to America), and send Communist propaganda to America. LI is 30 years old, a native of the T'aisan District, Kwangtung Province, and makes his headquarters at 121 Wing Lok Street, first floor.
5. One of the SCSB underground station for labor movement work in Hong Kong is at 11 Jordan Road, first floor, Kowloon. At this place recruiting is done among seamen and technical workers, to induce them to return to Communist China to work. CHANG Tung-chuan⁸ is in charge, assisted by LIU Nai⁹. The SCSB sent LI Po-chu (李破柱) as a special officer to direct operations from behind the scenes.
6. LI Heng-feng recruited CH'EN Ta-pai¹⁰, 36 years old and a native of Chungshan District, to get information on anti-Communist activities. CH'EN uses his position as reporter and editor of the Ta Chung Pao to cover his intelligence work.
7. After Dr. TAI An-sai⁶ returned from America, he went into the Chinese Customs service, in which he was able to amass a considerable fortune. He retired to Macao to live in leisure. K'O Lin and HO Hsien persuaded him to ally himself with the Chinese Communists, and Madame SUN Yat-sen sent a special representative from Shanghai to urge this step. After his defection, TAI was very energetic in persuading other Chinese Nationalists to follow his example. He attended all meetings, made frequent speeches, and was selected by the Communists to represent them, assisted by K'O Lin, in their unofficial negotiations with the Macao Government. In time TAI became restive under the orders of the Chinese Communists and their constant financial demands upon him, and in the spring of 1950 ceased his regular attendance at meetings. YUAN Hsiao, aware of the change, assigned members of the Armed Force Division to watch TAI, but in November 1950 still had hopes of using him. TAI is over 50 years old, and a native of Chungshan.
8. CH'EN Tao-ken¹¹ was recruited for Communist work by TU Lan, and defected at the same time as his son-in-law, HUANG Yu-t'ang. CH'EN has been very active in educational circles, recruiting and persuading Chinese schools to permit Communist activities and to revise their curricula to use Communist texts and eliminate all KMT teachings. Despite his work against church-supported schools, CH'EN has retained his position at St. Joseph's College. He is over 50 years old and usually wears Chinese dress.
9. In November 1950 a senior inspector of intelligence work was sent from Canton to Macao to inspect Communist activities and organizations. He stayed at the Nan Kuang Company and conferred with the various leaders, giving them instructions. This man, who was 28 years old and a native of the East River District, used the name YEH Lang (叶浪), believed to be an alias.

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
