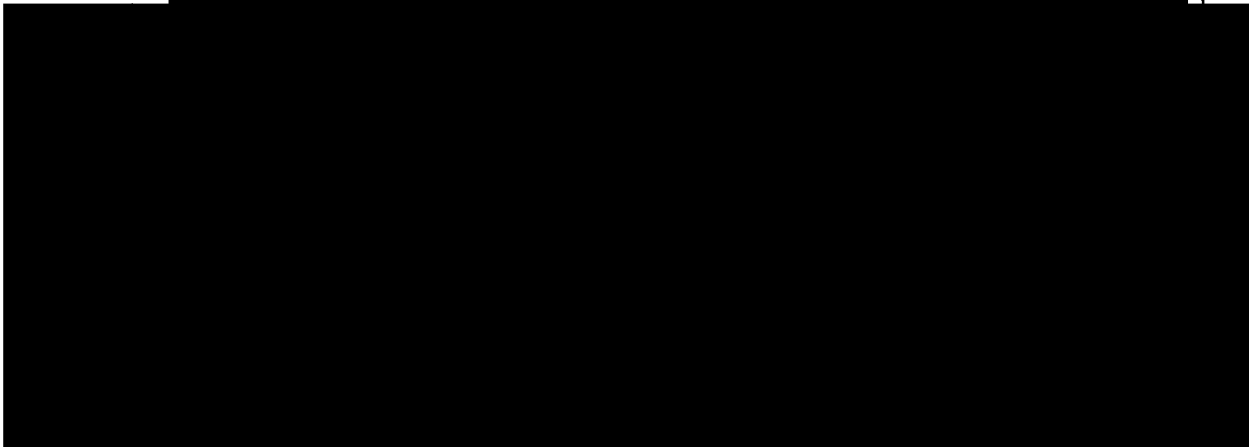

- 25X1X 2. [REDACTED], one an Argentine newspaperman and the other a member of the Federal Police, had stated that Arevalo was given such an order by the Argentine Government because, during his visit in Buenos Aires, he had been associating with undesirable members of the Communist, Radical, and Socialist Parties.\*\* However, source was unable to obtain positive confirmation from contacts within the Ministry of Foreign Relations.
- 3. Arevalo is attempting to return to Buenos Aires, and the Guatemalan Embassy is reportedly trying to make the necessary arrangements.

**Comment.** In spite of the affirmative information submitted by source, it would seem strange that Argentina would have resorted to such a step, which might tend to antagonize Argentine-Guatemalan relations, particularly at a time when Argentina through her policy of the Third position is trying to "win friends and influence people."
