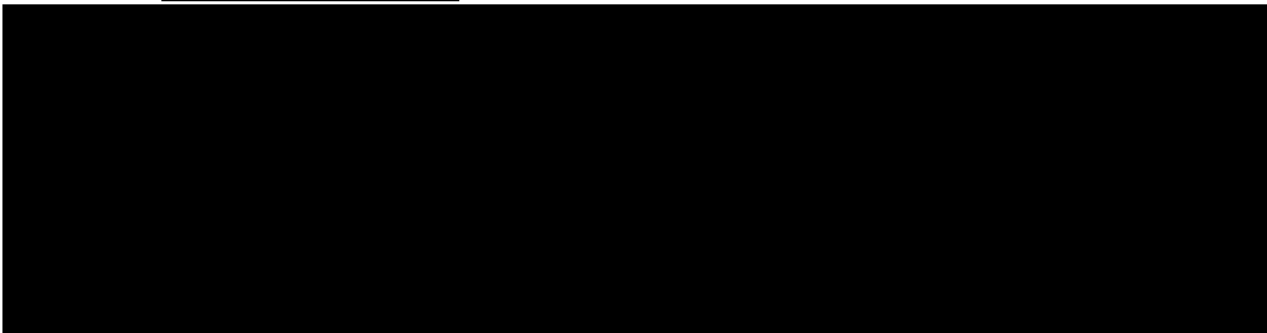

- According to an article published in the 4 August 1951 issue of the Prague newspaper Rude Pravo, the plan for the salvage of iron was fulfilled to the extent of 91.5 percent during the first half of 1951, and the salvage of non-ferrous metals to the extent of 106.0 percent of plan over the same period of time. However, another plan exists for the actual deliveries of the salvaged metals to industrial enterprises. During the first six months of 1951 this plan was fulfilled to the extent of 86.0 percent for iron and 65.0 percent for non-ferrous metals. The salvaged material which has not been delivered to the industrial enterprises is stored in the warehouses of the Salvage Raw Materials (Sberne suroviny), National Corporation.
- The deliveries to be made by Salvage Raw Materials, National Corporation, during the year 1951 in Bohemia and Moravia amount to 700,000 tons of iron, 110,000 tons of cast iron and 46,000 tons of non-ferrous metals. The deliveries to be made in Slovakia in 1951 are to amount to 46,000 tons of iron. The planned deliveries for 1952 are expected to amount to from 1,000,000 to 1,250,000 tons of iron.
