On 14 November 1951, 3,000 cavalry troops from the Inner Mongolian Military Area passed through Ssup'ingchieh (124-22, 43-11) by train for Tunghua (125-57, 41-43). The railway staff at the Mukden station stated that these troops came from Wulanhaot'e (烏爾漢浩特) with orders to reinforce the 2 Cavalry Division fighting in Korea.
