- 2. Both, a Soviet and a Hungarian unit, were stationed at the field. The aircraft observed there were parked in two distinct groups, one in the About port its eastern portion. The entrance there was guarded by a Hungarian soldier wearing white-bordered blue epaulets. (2)
- 3. On 10 October 1951, the field was occupied by three single-engine fighters, probably Yak-9s, fitted with inline engines, three-bladed metal propellers and landing gears retracting inward; 4 twin-engine transports, probably LI-2s, fitted with radial engines, single tail assemblies, landing gears retracting inward and cabin windows; and 48 jet planes, including 20 parked in the western portion and 28 parked in the eas mid-wing monoplan rudder assemblies upper third of the rudder assembly, landing wheels and nose wheels upper third of the rudder assembly, landing wheels and nose wheels retracting rearward, and air intakes divided by vertical partitions.(3)

5. The ammunition dump was guarded by a Soviet sentry. Another Soviet guard was seen at the end of the spur track where building materials were stored in the open. A Hungarian sentry was placed at the entrance in the northeast corner of the installation, another sentry was seen on its eastern edge.


