In late September 1951 the Central and South China Military Area organized and formally inaugurated the Kwangsi-Vietnam Border Region Military Liaison Team at Langson. Both the Chinese Communists and the Democratic Republic of Vietnam (DRV) appointed members to the team, whose major functions were to handle military problems along the Kwangsi-Vietnam border and to supervise various DRV military training organizations in the area. It was also responsible for transportation problems at Chennankuan (106-41, 22-04). The team established four sub-teams, at Ai Diem (107-01, 21-29), Chennankuan, Shuik'ou () and Lungpang (106-19, 22-52). In early November the team had a staff of 84.
