- 1. From a study of Austrian statistics on Yugoslav refugees arriving in Carinthia during the summer months of 1951, it is estimated that the number amounted to approximately 850 individuals. The estimate does not include Styria. Among the refugees there were approximately 170 Serbs and Macedonians, 210 Slovenes, and 470 Croats. The majority of the refugees are from the peasant and working class, although there have also been many from the field of sport and art, including ballet dancers, singers, musicians and the like. The average age of the refugees is between 17 and 35.
- 2. Ratimir Delorko, temor of the Magreb Opera, and Borislav Mobucar, one of its conductors, failed to return to Yugoslavia after the Salzburg Musical Festival in August 1951 in which they took part.
