In early August 1951 the naval personnel training center of the Pearl River Naval Command Headquarters was established in Tungkuan (113-46, 23-02). Trainees are all graduates of junior middle school and are good swimmers. The training period is 100 days. Soviet instructors are attached to the center. Upon graduation, the trainees are sent to serve in the Chinese Communist Navy in the Pearl River area. Since its institution, the center has graduated 80 trainees who are now sailing on various gunboats in the Pearl River area. On 1 October 1951 the training center was ordered to expand.
