- 2 Mechanical shop
- 4 Conveyer installation
- 5 Building, brick, 63 x 18 x 18 meters, housing the following installations:

- a to d Furnaces, producing each about 1,800 liters of oil per day.

- e and f Distillation equipment

- 6 New factory, same as item # 1
- 7 Benzine refinery, brick structure, 18 x 18 x 9 meters, completed in May 1948.
- 8 Oxygen plant, old brick structure, 18 x 9 x 13½ meters
- 9 Four oil tanks; one of these tanks, having a capacity of two million liters, was built in 1948; the other three tanks, having a capacity of 1 million liters each, existed in 1946.
- 10 Old boilerhouse, brick structure, 18 x 18 x 22½ meters, two boilers, one of which is in operation.
- 11 Building, slate stone, 9 x 13½ x 13½ meters, production of varnish started in March 1949.
- 12 Building, brick, 30 x 13½ x 10½ meters, completed in June 1948. "Estolack" factory; six of the 12 boilers planned for this factory were standing at the time source worked there.\*
- 13 Building, old limestone structure, adjoining # 12,

- a Acetone production, six balloons, each 3½ meters high and 60 cm or 15 cm in diameter.

- b Benzine refinery, six boilers 2.7 meters high and 1.8 meters in diameter, ten boilers 1.8 meters high and 75 cm in diameter

- 14 Tar factory, brick structure, 18 x 9 x 13½ meters, four boilers, each 5½ meters high and 1.8 meters in diameter
- 15 Plant entrance
- 16 Administration of the Estonian Combine
- 17 Line level, south, 4.8 km long with several cross-cuts
- 18 Line level, north, 6.88 km long with several cross-cuts, presently under water
- 19 Line level, east, 8 km long with five cross-cuts, each 1 km long

- C Civilian hospital
- D PW Camp No 7289/3
