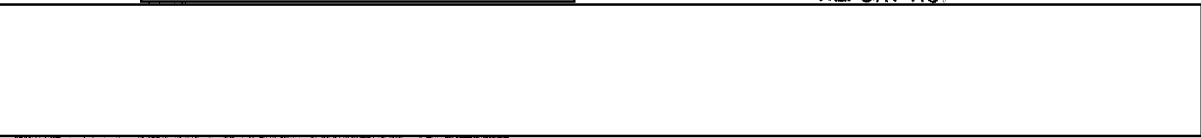

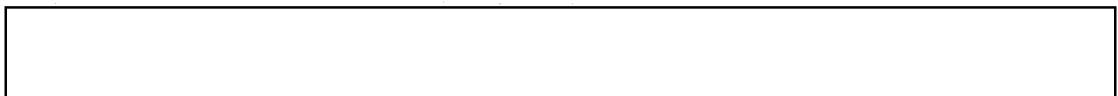

1. On 26 December 1951, a group of 35 Democratic Republic of Vietnam (DRV) Army officers, who had been in training for a year at the DRV Military School at Lungchou (third class), arrived in Lang Son. A meeting was held and the experiences of the group in China were discussed. Following this, they were conducted to Bac Kan, Tuyen Quang, and Chiem Hoa.
2. On 28 December 1951, a group of 24 young Chinese Communist staff officers arrived at Lang Son. They were destined to serve in the ranks of the Lien Quan Bien Canh, and would be allocated as follows:
 - a. Five for the 32 Division at Lang Son
 - b. Twelve for the 28 Division at Mon Cay
 - c. Seven for the 61 Division.
