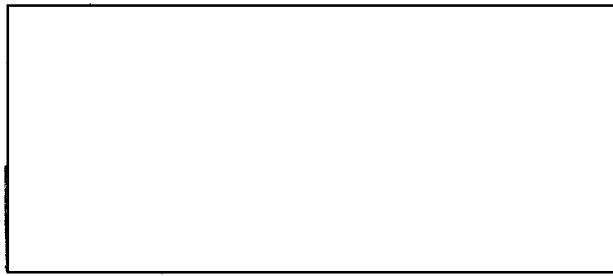

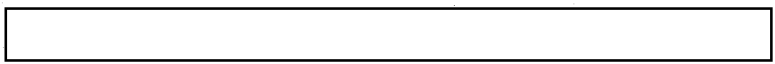

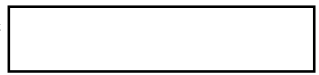

A. Soviet Personnel:

1. Bandurko; Tel. Jena 5166. Was industry officer of SMA for Jena.
2. Lt. Col. Byaltyukov; Tel. Weimar 270. Soviet procurement officer for Soviet retail shops in Germany.
3. Dunayev; Tel. Weimar 664. Was chief of Section I, Reparations Division, SMA Thuringia.
4. Kommissarov; Tel. Weimar 661. Was chief of Section IV, Reparations Division, SMA Thuringia.
5. Lt. Lantsov; Tel. Weimar 206. Not identified as yet.
6. Dr. Mardis; Tel. Berlin 50 2707. ("50" is the Karlshorst exchange.) Purchased surgical lamps (Operationsleuchten) and immersion refractometer (Eintauchrefraktometer) from Carl Zeiss Jena.
7. Major Ostrovski; Tel Weimar 334. Was an officer in the Industry Division, SMA, in Weimar.
8. Rodin; Tel. Weimar 660. Was the first Soviet official responsible for acceptance of diamond dies from Carl Zeiss Jena.
9. Senin; Tel. Berlin 50 1059. From 1948 to 1950, was concerned with purchase of wire mesh from Metallweberei Neustadt/Orla, and with purchases of diamonds from Zeiss; predecessor of Stesnov (see below).
10. Smirnov; Tel. Weimar 311. Was deputy to Yakovlev.
11. Smirnova; Tel. Weimar 666. Wife of Smirnov (above), succeeded Tretyakov (see below).

12. Spankov; Tel. Berlin 50 0327. Was chief of the Industry Division for Germany, SMA, Berlin-Karlshorst.
 13. Stepanov; Tel. Berlin 50 0331. Was chief of Section II, Reparations Division, SMA, Berlin-Karlshorst.
 14. Stesnov; Tel. Berlin 50 1503. Responsible for purchase of wire screening in Neustadt/Orla; successor to Senin.
 15. Major Stsskind; Tel. Weimar 481. Officer in Industry Division, SMA Thuringia, in Weimar.
 16. Sultanov. Was deputy to Senin (see above).
 17. Tatyán; Tel. Weimar 670. Was chief of Section V, Reparations Division, SMA Thuringia.
 18. Tretyakov; Tel. Weimar 652. Was paymaster for German acceptance engineers employed by Reparations Division, SMA, in Weimar.
 19. Tsimailo, Petr Petrovich; Tel. Weimar 662. Was chief of Section II, Reparations Division, SMA Thuringia, in Weimar. Now rumored to be in the Moscow office of Tekhnoprom.
 20. Ulyanov; Tel. Weimar 662. Officer in Section II, Reparations Division, SMA Thuringia. Lived in Weimar, Grossmutterleite 32.
 21. "Vera" (Inu); Tel. Weimar 649. Was secretary to Yakovlev, and later to his successor, Bayandurov.
 22. Yakovlev; Tel. Weimar 440. Was chief of Reparations Division, SMA Thuringia; predecessor of Bayandurov.
- B. German Personnel employed by the SMA:
1. Demmler; Tel. Jena 8-252. Assigned to the Schott & Gen. glass works, Jena.
 2. Dreyden. Assigned to Waggonbau Weimar (SAG Transmasch), where he is still employed.
 3. Eichhorn, Tel. Jena 8-242. Assigned to Schott & Gen.
 4. Kleimann; Tel. Weimar 663. Acceptance engineer employed by Tatyán.
 5. Schmidt; Tel. Weimar 417. Was interpreter for Byaltyukov (above).
