The field had a rolled cover, small sodded plains and three concrete runways, each about 25 x 800 to 1,000 meters. Concreting and drainage work was done between the summer of 1947 and fall of 1948. After the fall of 1947, 25 aircraft revenuents in the mountain slope and 15 on the side of the river were lined with mooden logs and camouflaged by shrubs.					
	2.	There were no mangars. A "pillar roof", about 10x20 meters, serving as a workshop, and a wooden assembly frame were erected in front of a quartering bunker in the mountain slope.


