2. The plant makes advance requests for the necessary raw material every three months. The request is submitted to the Minister for Heavy Industry, who decides which Export-Import enterprise or which domestic concern will supply Gamma.

3. During June and July, 1951, the Gamma Works used the following raw materials:

Steel: Rods- (round, flat and square)
up to 60% fine, 40% raw. 80% Martin,
20% electrolytic steel 40 tons

Sheets- mainly boiler steel,
(supplied by Ozd, Csepel, Ferroglobus,
Metalloglobus, Hoffherr)
Electrolytic steel from supplies
of the past war 15 tons

Cast Iron: 15 tons

" 20 " Russian type artillery, Theodolite (?)
" 50 " Russian type mirror periscopes.
" 35-40 " Antiaircraft instruments (?)

In addition, a large number of fuses for dish mines, optical instruments, and artillery levels, periscopes, "Majak" Triangles, Goniometers, and Logarithmic rods for the artillery.

6. The Gamma Works have been enlarged by three new buildings. This is the so-called "FG" Factory which will start the manufacture of radar equipment on 1 January 1952.
