Airfields are located in the following places in Poland:

25X1

- Bielany (R53/P99)** A very large airfield is reportedly being completed at Bielany.\* Soviet jet planes which have been seen flying over Warsaw are allegedly already stationed there.
- Balice (Q51/Z15)** A new airfield is under construction. Placards are posted around the site forbidding civilians to enter the area.
- Elblag (Q55/Y90)** At the airfield in Elblag, an unspecified Polish fighter regiment, equipped with YAK 9's, is stationed.\*\*
- Malbork (Q55/D79)** An airfield which the Germans built on the outskirts of Malbork is not in use at present. The field has one hangar and several smaller buildings. There is no unit stationed at the field and no activity has been observed there.\*\*\*
- Okaywie (Q55/Y44)** On the small island (sic) of Okaywie in the Baltic Sea, there are an active military airfield and radio installations. It is believed that the field is integrated with the coastal defenses being installed along the peninsula as far as Hel.
- Lodz (Q52/O93)** At the Lodz airfield a regiment of JT-2 (or IT-2)\*\*\*\* assault planes is stationed. Lodz also has workshops for the repair of all types of planes except jets.
- Krakow (Q51/Z24)** A Polish air regiment equipped with YAK-9's is stationed at the pre-war field in a suburb of Krakow where the 1st Polish Air Regiment was located before the war.\*\*\*\*\*
- Orneta (coords unknown)** A Soviet airfield is located at Orneta about 45 km. from Sutkovo (R53/K74) on the rail line to Pieniczno (coords unknown) near the USSR border. A Soviet air unit is stationed there. Entrance to the area is prohibited.
