RETURN TO CIA LIBRARY

1. On 13 February 1952, a hutment was located along Highway 96, just at the railroad overpass in Teltow (N 53/2 73). The headquarters of the unit was presumably billeted in a detached house opposite the hutment. The house had a sentry posted in front of it and maintained communications with the hutment. On 1 March, source determined that one low wooden building in the hutment was capable of housing 60 to 80 soldiers and that there were several small, neglected wooden sheds which were apparently no longer used and a large garage with 13 numbered bays. Three trucks were in the garage. Sentries and about 10 soldiers with crimson epaulets were noticed at the hutment on 1 March. Truck [redacted], occupied by 15 soldiers with red epaulets, was seen leaving the hutment toward Stahnsdorf on 13 February. [redacted] 25X1

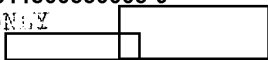
