1. The Carl Zeiss works at Jena needed 1.5 tons of methylene chloride for the Heilit screens of 79 A-1 training devices to be produced for the Russians in 1952. The supply was ordered from the Agfa-Wolfen works; Agfa-Wolfen, however, was not only unable to supply Zeiss, but could not maintain a sufficient supply for its own use.
2. At the beginning of April 1952, Paul Förster of the Material Procurement Department of Zeiss obtained 7.5 tons of methylene chloride [redacted] Six tons, currently stored at Zeiss, will be delivered to Agfa Wolfen.
