25X1X 1. On 16 April 1952, the Loewen Kaserne in Doberitz (N 53/Z 65) south of Highway 103, was occupied by a tank unit. [redacted] 25X1C

25X1X 2. On 16 April, 15 light field howitzers, 8 rocket launchers, an undetermined number of heavy guns with a caliber of approximately 152-mm and numerous parked motor vehicles were seen in Olympische Dorf, 2 km west of Altes Lager. **

25X1C 3. A unit quartered in Olympische Dorf, was entrained at the Dallgow-Doberitz railroad station during the period from 15 to 17 April. Numerous trucks carrying a few soldiers, billeting equipment, ammunition boxes, food were seen passing individually through Rohrbeck en route to the station during these days. [redacted]

They were loaded at Dallgow-Doberitz railroad station on three trains. Between 12 and 15 x 57-mm AT guns were noticed. On 17 April, [redacted] Olympische Dorf which had housed about 1,000 troops and, until the fall of 1951, had been occupied by a war academy, was vacant. [redacted] the unit moved to the Temp- lin (N 54/U 61) troop training grounds. **

[redacted] the Soviet main Kech which is superior to the Loewen Kaserne, Adler Kaserne, Flak Kaserne, Altes Lager, Neues Lager and the komendatura, is stationed in the former German camp headquarters south of Altes Lager. A Kech-branch repair shop which from April to October 1951 was under supervision of Lieutenant Tehranov (fnu) was in Altes Lager. Lieutenant Tehranov allegedly was in Jueterbog (N 52/E 69) for a course and was expected to return to the Loewen Kaserne. In late 1951, the Kech branch office was directed by Lieutenant Vasilev (fnu) who was relieved by an unidentified officer. *** Two hospitals were also located in Olympische Dorf. *** [Redacted] Comment. Previous information indicated that Unit Colonel Khlopov (fnu) [Redacted] of the 11th (?) Gds AT Arty Brigade is in the western section, a hospital with Major Kochev (fnu) is in the southern section, and a motor transport unit commanded by Major Kovalov (fnu) is in the eastern section of Olympische Dorf. [Redacted] guns, as observed in paragraph 2 of the present report, had been seen there previously. It is possible that these guns belong to the 1st Necz Div, as the quarters of the 293d (?) Gds How Arty Bn and of the unidentified rocket launcher battalion of the 1st Necz Div have not been definitely established. However, further information is needed. [Redacted] the Khlopov unit moved to Camp Burgwall, near Templin, prior to 18 April. [Redacted]

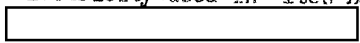

*** [Redacted] Comment. Lieutenant Vasilev (fnu) is perhaps identical with a Major Vasilev (fnu), who, in mid-December 1951, was responsible for paying for electricity used in Altes Lager and Neues Lager and at the Doeberitz Kommandatura.
