Trucks  were seen engaged in the unloading in Potsdam. On the same day, 41 boxcars and 18 flatcars were dispatched in Wildpark to Zossen  while 30 boxcars went from Griebnitzsee to Wuensdorf  (1)

Comments.

- (1) These trains confirm previous information on the situation which resulted from the transfer between Potsdam and the Muenzdorf area of Soviet offices and units. [redacted] 50X1-HUM
- [redacted] trains between the Griebnitzsee, Potsdam and Wildpark and Muenzdorf railroad stations during the period from 27 to 29 May and 7 trains in reverse direction during the same period. 50X1-HUM
- (2) On 26 and 27 May, [redacted] four troop trains dispatched at the Neubrandenburg and Muenstermark railroad stations for Jerichow. [redacted] 50X1-HUM
- [redacted] However, the reference report indicated that [redacted] came from Neubrandenburg. [redacted] was reported for the first time. 50X1-HUM
- (3) According to the two receiving stations, the two trains would have carried units of the 12th Gds Tank Div. No information is available to indicate when these units moved to Altengrabow or which units of the division were involved. Therefore, it is believed that at least one of the two trains went to Neustrelitz where, on 28 May, a train carrying elements of the 121st (?) AA Bgt of the 9th Gds Tank Div was unloaded. These elements probably belonged to the units of this regiment which went to Altengrabow in late April. [redacted] 50X1-HUM
- (4) The train may have carried a unit of the unidentified AA division of the Fourth Gds Recz Army in Fuerstenwalde which was unloaded in Jueterbog in late February 1952. 50X1-HUM
- (5) The dispatching stations and receiving stations furnish no indications as to what units were loaded. 50X1-HUM
- (6) The composition of the train as well as its direction fairly definitely indicates that the train carried old vehicles. [redacted]

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
