- 25X1 1. The construction office of the United Shipyards, Gdansk, is at present working on plans for cargo vessels up to 5,000 BRT, on orders from Soviet authorities. The work is being supervised by engineers Dorfer and Gospodarowicz. The same engineers produced the plans for the Soviet trawlers which are now under construction in the shipyard.
- 2. A commission of Soviet engineers visited the Trans-Odra Wagon and Bridge Construction Works (Zaodrzanskie Zaklady Budowy Wagonow i Mostow) at Zielona Gora (Gruenberg). The object of the visit was to inspect a hall used by the Germans during the war for the construction of submarines.
- 25X1 [Redacted] the Soviet commission was studying the possibilities of resuming the production of submarines.
