1. In the 1952 "Spring Epidemic Precaution Campaign," medical personnel visited all homes in Canton and gave vaccinations against smallpox. After an individual was vaccinated, a stamp was placed opposite his name on the household registration card. He received no vaccination certificate. Passengers buying tickets to Macao or Hong Kong do not need to produce certificates of smallpox vaccinations; and such certificates are not required by customs offices at border posts.
