- The Chinese Communist outpost at Changhong (unlocated possibly Chinghaw, 98-58; 23-18) has been shifted further north to Honawng (unlocated), a Shan village. The outpost at Changhong is manned by 20 Atsi and Shan armed guards under the command of DWICHANG, a Shan heaman.
- 2. A motor road from T'engch'ung (98-29; 25-01) to Nantien (98-20; 24-49) and thence to the Kanyai (98-05; 24-46) plains is under construction by the Chinese Communists. The construction work is being done by civilian communal labor under the military authorities. At present the road will take jeep traffic up to Kanyai in the dry season only. No vehicles have been seen on the road between Kanyai and Nantien to date.
- 3. A similar road is under construction from Nantien to the Lungch uan (97-55; 24-20) plain.
- Chinese Communist military officers in the Lungch'uan area are recruiting volunteers from among the Kachins, Atsis, and Shans. The new recruits are being given military training at Lungch uan and Changhong.
- The Chinese Communist authorities have posted armed security volunteers at the following passes along the China-Burma border:

Chimeli Pass (98-44; 26-11) Hpimaw Pass 98-41; 25-58) 98+40; 25-49) Fenshuiling Pass 98-30; 25-48) Lagwi Pass Hpare Pass 98-23; 25-48) Pan Wa Pass 98-22: 25-35) Satjang Pass (Unlocated)

RETURN TO RECORDS CENTER IMMEDIATELY AFTER USE

Only a few Lisu traders are allowed to leave Chinese terriroty through any of these passes. Chinese who are not members of authorized Communist organizations cannot enter Chinese territory at these locations. CLASSIFICATION

There have been numerous reports that the Chinese Communists are pushing road construction on the Burma-Yunnan border. 25X1 the Chinese Communists were rushing completion of a road from Cheli (100-51; 21-58) to the Burma border. From other information available in this office, it is apparent that the Chinese Communists are also interested in a possible route farther south from Puerh through Lantsang (98-41; 28-32) to Mengma (99-23; 22-13) to Kengtung.
