Soviet Troops.

1. Prior to the fall of 1951, the former Slaughter House Barracks on Lévonat Street in Győr (P 48/Y 44) was occupied by Soviet troops. The installation consisted of a two-story main building, about 60 x 15 meters, and several smaller annexes. Six or seven canvas-covered guns of about 150 mm caliber were seen in the barracks yard. They had pneumatic tires and muzzle brakes. Prior to December 1951, about 100 Soviet soldiers were quartered in several private houses and a boat house south of the Small Danube River just east of Révfülu Bridge. According to local residents, they belonged to a telephone line construction unit.

Hungarian Troops.

2. Prior to December 1951, the barracks installation on the west side of Kabok Lajos Street, formerly Teleki Street, and, adjoining to southwest, an old barracks installation on Rozsa Ferenc Street, formerly Apsca Street, were occupied by Hungarian border guard troops. * Other Hungarian soldiers whose service color could not be determined were seen in the Rakoczy Barracks, formerly Frigyes Barracks. A guarded Hungarian depot was located in former boat houses on the northern bank of the Small Danube River east of Révfülu Bridge. A large number of pontoons was seen there. Prior to the summer of 1951, some new low brick buildings and several motor vehicle sheds were constructed on an area, about 400 x 150 meters, at the intersection of Copron Street and Regi posta Street south of the Győr-Budapest railroad line and east of the main railroad station. Hungarian soldiers with red service color, some motor vehicles and guns of an undetermined caliber were noticed there.
3. In June 1951, several deferred members of the classes up to 1901, including source, were registered for the draft in Győr, and most of them were classified physically fit.
4. In January 1952, the new barracks installation south of Pápa (P 48/Y 30) which was

still under construction was occupied by Hungarian soldiers. About two thirds of them wore red service color and about one third green service color. Soldiers were repeatedly seen engaged in service of the piece drill in the barracks yard. Never were there more than two guns at one time whose caliber was estimated at 70 or 80 mm. Some officers' apartment houses had been constructed on the road from the town to the installation about 500 meters north of the installation. This road was paved with squared stones as, according to construction workers, a tank unit was to occupy one section of the installation. **

5. In the summer of 1951, a troop tent camp was northwest of Városloed (P 48/D 58). While passing by twice, source noticed that a number of telephone lines led into the camp where soldiers were practicing.
6. During the period from 10 to 12 December 1951, the 1932 class was registered for the draft in the town hall of Pápa. The draftees received no individual induction orders but were informed collectively by posters.
7. Prior to October 1951, a Hungarian tank unit was quartered in the new barracks installation north of Tata Tóváros (P 48/X 94). The personnel of this unit wore blue service color including some with a small tank as branch-of-service insignia. Soldiers were repeatedly seen practicing at a training field between Tata Tóváros and Vertesszoellces (Q 48/Y 94). No armored vehicles were seen there. An observation tower was in the center of the training field. ***
8. Prior to the fall of 1951, source repeatedly noticed a low building surrounded by a wire fence and guarded by soldiers with undetermined service color about 4 km. northeast of the Panhida (Q 48/Y 94) railroad station. This building was connected with the railroad station by a rather poor road. Local residents said that an ammunition depot located deep in the rock was located there.
