- 1. On 23 June 1952, 1,000 troops of the 13 Army moved from the Ssumao (101-04, 22-47) -P'uerh (101-05, 23-03) area to the Lants'ang (99-59, 22-35) -Menglien (99-36, 22-20) -Mengma (99-23, 22-13) area.
- 2. In late June, 600 troops of the 14 Army moved from Chenk ang (99-25, 24-07) and Mienning (100-03, 23-52) to the Chichiang (0003/3068) -Mengtung (99-15, 23-09)
 - 3. In late June the Chinese Communists were planning to retake the Mengmao (97-52, 21-02) area, thereby cutting off the Nationalist troops from Bhamo and Myitkyina, and use it as a base for NAW SENG and his troops.1
