- On 1 July 1952, a Soviet-operated radar station was on a hill at approximately 125-35, 39-09; YD-244354, north of Puch'ang-ni (125-36, 39-08) (YD-2534). The radar mast was approximately 5 meters high; and the antenna, which was continuously revolving, was ladder shaped and 2 meters in length. The hill was covered with chestnut trees and cryptomeria.
- 2. Approximately 15 Soviet signal and guard troops were in dugouts next to the radar station, and an additional 25 Soviet troops were in the village of Che-dong (125-35, 39-09) YD-2336), which is approximately 500 meters north of Puch ang-ni. The troops were commanded by a Soviet lieutenant. They did their own cooking and household chores, and no Koreans were employed by them.
