1. The Czechoslovak Army's preliminary maneuvers were to begin 25 July 1952 in the Ceske Budejovice -Pisek area. The forces engaged in these maneuvers were to be the 1 Mixed Division of the Frontier Guard and the 3,7, and 11 Battalions of the SNB. The maneuvers were to be directed by General Frantisek Janda, commanding the 1 Military District of Prague.
2. A Soviet military mission was to be at the maneuvers and was to be accompanied by Colonel Chocholov and Major Kusnecov of the Soviet Embassy at Prague.
3. For the first time, the new cavalry units formed since 1 October 1951 and units from the 1 Motorized Corps (Motomechanizovany Sbor) were to operate at maneuvers as independent units.
4. The problem to be worked out at maneuvers was set up by General Jaromir Blaha, of the Czechoslovak General Staff, and was approved by the Soviet military authorities. It consisted of two phases:
 - a. Drive back an enemy attacking from the American Zone in Austria, along the line Linz-Passeau, in the direction of Praha (Prague).
 - b. Counter-attack the enemy flank, from a line of departure in the Soviet Zone in Austria, in the directions Gmuend and Vienna.
5. The maneuvers were to last five days, to be followed by other maneuvers in Czechoslovakia, East Germany, and Hungary, lasting till the second half of September 1952.
