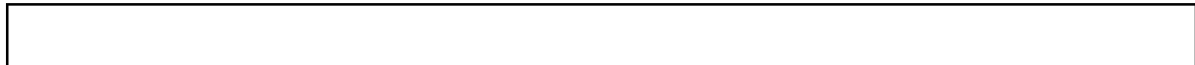

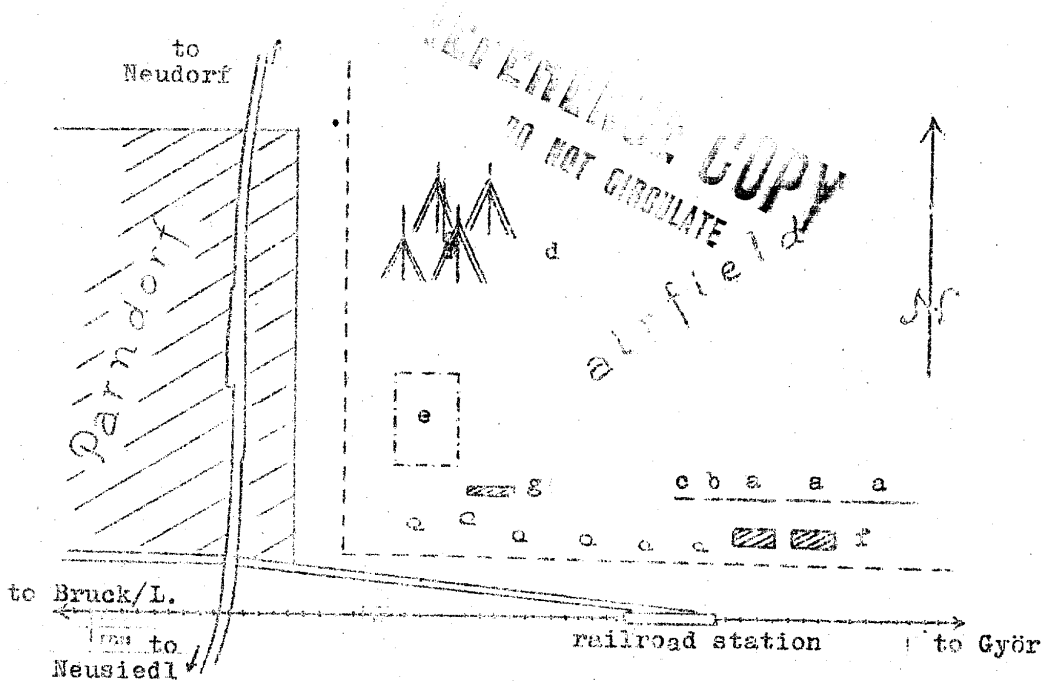

- a. three rows of 25 to 28 jet fighters in all*
- b. one single-engine fighter
- c. one biplane
- d. four antenna masts 12 to 15 feet high erected in a square with a small wooden cabin in the center; there was a thin pole nine to twelve feet high on the side of the cabin
- e. athletic field surrounded by a wooden fence
- f. two buildings use undetermined
- g. a temporary building.

No flying activity or vehicle traffic was observed. A number of trucks were parked under trees in the southern part of the airfield. A truck

drove from Parndorf railroad station to the airfield.

[REDACTED] Comment: The general impression exists that the former fighter types have been replaced by jet fighters throughout the entire Soviet zone of Austria. Single-engine fighters are seen only occasionally. Bombers and special ground attack airplanes have not been observed.
