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٦. Ship Repairs

a. MUDEUG (1,000 BRT)

This vessel was completed and handed over to Russians on 7 June 1952. Work on the vessel appears to have met with satisfaction as a message radiced from the Captain, Yaroshchuk, thanks the Werft for its good work which enabled the ship to have a trouble-free journey in spite of heavy storms in the North Sea (see Appendix A). Work carried out on this ship included the installation of boilers and of two American diesel engines, each of 450 hp.

Paint work: Below waterline - black Above waterline - white

SOVETSKI SOYUZ (24,000 ERT)

Although work on this wessel is being speeded up, the completion date is not expected for about another year. The fitting of the cabins is now complete, also the fitting of the shafts. This vessel is also to be equipped with American engines and transmission.

c. YAKUTTA (8,000 BRT)

Work completed on this vessel includes the installation of 4 American type boilers. The vessel is now 95% complete and 13 October 1952 is the date named for the trial run.
