All Soviet supervisory personnel employed in the various departments of Arsenal No 1 were constantly being rotated and, as a result, [redacted] never [redacted] any one person longer than two to three months at a time. The only Soviet who remained at the same job [redacted] was the chief engineer. [redacted] his name [redacted] sounded like Kasbeck; he was the most important figure at Arsenal No 1, as he directed production. The director of the plant was the administrative chief -- and a figurehead. [redacted] no direct contact with him whatsoever. [redacted] plant directors who were at Arsenal No 1 [redacted] were approximately six during the period 1946-52. The director of the plant, the chief engineer, and the chief designer and his staff were all Soviets. There were approximately 3000 employees at Arsenal No 1 (this total includes both Soviets and Germans). See Enclosure (A), an organization chart of Arsenal No 1, Kiev, USSR.

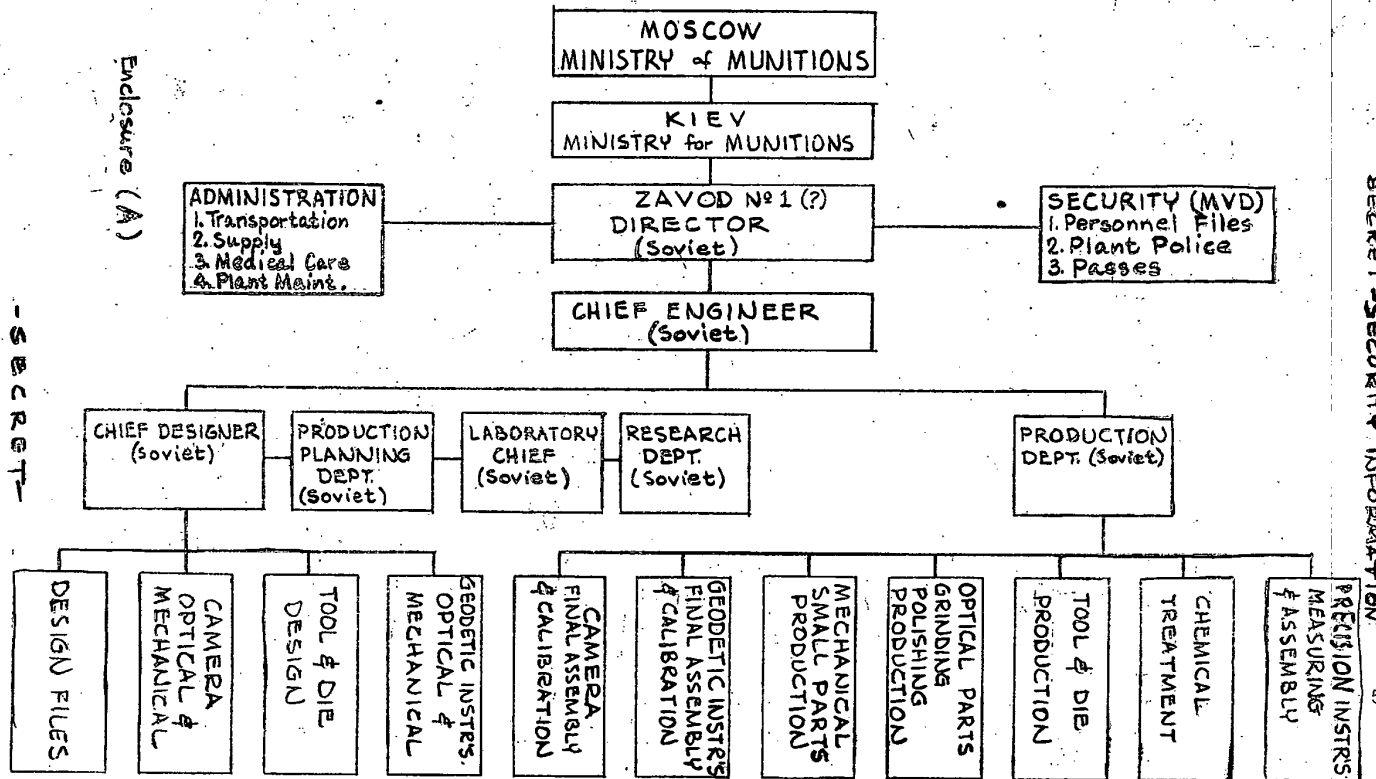
